1<sup>st</sup> Scripture Hebrews 13:1-8, 15-16 (Common English Bible)

**13** Keep loving each other like family. <sup>2</sup> Don't neglect to open up your homes to guests, because by doing this some have been hosts to angels without knowing it. <sup>3</sup> Remember prisoners as if you were in prison with them, and people who are mistreated as if you were in their place. <sup>4</sup> Marriage must be honored in every respect, with no cheating on the relationship, because God will judge the sexually immoral person and the person who commits adultery. <sup>5</sup> Your way of life should be free from the love of money, and you should be content with what you have. <sup>7</sup> When he noticed how the guests chose the places of honor, he told them a parable. <sup>8</sup> "When you are invited by someone to a wedding banquet, do not sit down at the place of honor, in case someone more distinguished than you has been invited by your host; <sup>9</sup> and the host who invited both of you may come and say to you, 'Give this person your place,' and then in disgrace you would start to take the lowest place. <sup>10</sup> But when you are invited, go and sit down at the lowest place, so that when your host comes, he may say to you, 'Friend, move up higher'; then you will be honored in the presence of all who sit at the table with you. <sup>11</sup> For all who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted."
