

Blessing of the Water of Lake Superior

One: Lake Superior is fed by over 200 rivers. The largest include the Nipigon River, the St. Louis River, the Pigeon River, the Pic River, the White River, the Michipicoten River, the Bois Brule River and the Kaministiquia River. Lake Superior is home to about 80 species of fish, including carp and varieties of trout, salmon, and perch. Lake Superior contains nearly 70 million diporeia (shrimplike creatures) with a total biomass greater than that of the human population in the entire Lake Superior basin. Lake Superior is home to many species of birds, including varieties of hawks, eagles, loons, owls, and woodpeckers. There is a small population of endangered whooping cranes on the lake's north shore, one of only two crane species in North America. Migrating birds of prey funnel down Lake Superior's north shore in great numbers each fall. On a single day, at Duluth's Hawk Ridge, as many as 100,000 birds of prey might pass by.

All: Bless all rivers that feed Lake Superior, gitchi-gami, to refresh and renew the waters and all life. Bless all that lives and moves in, above, and around this body of water.
