**Scripture Reading Mark 1:1-20 (The First Egalitarian Translation)** 

**1:1** Here begins the gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God: **2** as it was written in Isaiah the prophet: "I send my messenger before you to prepare your way, **3** a herald's voice in the desert, crying, 'Make ready the way of our God. Clear a straight path.'"

**4** And so John the Baptizer appeared in the desert, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. **5** The whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem went out to John and were baptized by him in the Jordan River as they confessed their sins. **6** John was clothed in camel's hair and wore a leather belt around his waist, and he ate nothing but grasshoppers and wild honey. **7** In the course of his preaching, John said, "One more powerful than I is to come after me. I am not fit to stoop and untie his sandal straps. **8** I have baptized you by water, but the One to come will baptize you in the Holy Spirit."

**9** It was then that Jesus came from Nazareth in Galilee and was baptized in the Jordan River by John. **10** Immediately upon coming out of the water, Jesus saw the heavens opening and the Spirit descending upon him like a dove. **11** Then a voice from heaven came from the heavens: "You are my Beloved, my Own. On you my favor rests."

12 Immediately the Spirit drove Jesus out into the wilderness, 13 and he remained there for forty days, and was tempted by Satan. He was with the wild beasts, and the angels looked after him. 14 After John's arrest, Jesus appeared in Galilee proclaiming the Good News of God: 15 "This is the time of fulfillment. The reign of God is at hand! Change your hearts and minds, and believe this Good News!" 16 While walking by the Sea of Galilee, Jesus saw the brothers Simon and Andrew casting their nets into the sea, since they fished by trade. 17 Jesus said to them, "Follow me; I will make you fishers of humankind." 18 Immediately Jesus called them, and they left their nets and followed him.

**19** Proceeding a little further along, Jesus saw the brothers James and John Bar-Zebedee. They too were in their bout, putting their nets in order. **20** Immediately Jesus called them, and they left their father Zebedee standing in the boat with the hired help, and went off in the company of Jesus.
