


Passing of the Peace Scripture Readings

1st Scripture Genesis 2:4b-22 (The Schoken Bible: Volume 1)

4 At the time of *Adonai Elohim* (YWHW), God's making of earth and heaven, 5 No bush of the field was yet on earth, no plants of the field yet sprung up. For *Adonai Elohim* (YHWH) had not made it to rain upon earth, and there was no human/*adam* to till the soil/*adama*- 6 But a surge would well up from the ground and watered all the face of the soil.

7 Then Adonai Elohim (YHWH) formed the human, of the dust from the ground, he blew into his nostrils the breath of life and the human became a living being. 8 Then Adonai Elohim (YHWH) planted a garden in Eden/Land of Pleasure in the east, and there he placed the human whom he had formed. 9 Adonai Elohim (YWHW) caused to spring from the soil every type of tree, desirable to look at and good to eat, the Tree of Life in the midst of the garden, and the

Tree of the Knowing of Good and Evil. 10 Now a river flowed out of Eden, to water the garden, and from there it divides and became four stream-heads. 11 The name of the first one is Pishon/*Spreader* - that is the one that circles through the whole land of the Havilah, where gold is; 12 the gold of that land is good there too are bdellium and the precious stone carnelian. 13 The name of the second river is Gihon/*Gusher*— that is the one that circles through the whole land of Cush. 14 The name of the third river is Hiddikel/Tigris—that is the one that goes to the east of Assyria. And the fourth river- that is Perat/Euphrates.

15 Then Adonai Elohim (YHWH) took the human and set him in the Garden of Eden in order to work it and watch it. 16 Then Adonai Elohim (YHWH) commanded concerning the human saying: "From every (other) tree of the garden you may eat, yes, eat, 17 but from the Tree of the Knowing of Good and Evil you are not to eat from that. For on that day you eat from it, you must die, yes, die.

18 Then Adonai Elohim (YHWH) said, "It is not good for the human to be alone. I will make a helper corresponding to him." 19 So Adonai Elohim (YWHW) had formed from the soil every living-thing of the field and every fowl of the heavens, and brought them to the human to see what he would call it; and whatever the human called it as a living being, that was its name. 20 The human called out names for every herd-animal, and for the fowl of the heavens and for every living-thing, of the field; but for the human there could be found no helper corresponding to him. 21 So, Adonai Elohim (YHWH) caused a deep slumber to fall on the human, so that he slept; he took one of his ribs and closed up the flesh in its place. 22 Adonai Elohim (YHWH) built the rib that he had taken from the human, into a woman. And brought her to the human.

2nd Scripture John 1:1-18 (New Revised Standard Version Catholic Edition)

1 In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. 2 He was in the beginning with God. 3 All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being 4 in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. 5 The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.

6 There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. 7 He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. 8 He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. 9 The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world.

10 He was in the world, and the world came into being through him; yet the world did not know him. 11 He came to what was his own, and his own people did not accept him. 12 But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God, 13 who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God.

14 And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth. 15 (John testified to him and cried out, "This was he of whom I said, 'He who comes after me ranks ahead of me because he was before me.") 16 From his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace. 17 The law indeed was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. 18 No one has ever seen God. It is God the only Son, who is close to the Father's heart, who has made him known.
